**Guidance**

Funding allocated using pupil premium data from October Census.

To deliver evidence-based approaches to supporting disadvantaged pupils. In line with EEF guidance, activities should include:

- Support quality of teaching e.g) staff development
- Provide targeted academic support eg) tutoring
- Deal with non-academic barriers to success eg) attendance, behaviour, social and emotional support

Funding can be spent on a wider cohort of students than those who attract the funding. Direct the funding where the need is greatest.

**Planned expenditure**

Small group and 1:1 tuition	<p>The EEF has identified that small group tuition and 1:1 tuition are defined as:</p> <p>“Small group tuition is defined as one teacher, trained teaching assistant or tutor working with two to five pupils together in a group. This arrangement enables the teaching to focus exclusively on a small number of learners, usually in a separate classroom or working area. Intensive tuition in small groups is often provided to support lower attaining learners or those who are falling behind, but it can also be used as a more general strategy to ensure effective progress, or to teach challenging topics or skills.”</p> <p>“One to one tuition involves a teacher, teaching assistant or other adult giving a pupil intensive individual support. It may happen outside of normal lessons as additional teaching – for example as part of extended school time or a summer school – or as a replacement for other lessons.”</p> <p>CWA Buckinghamshire are delivering both small group tuition and 1:1 tuition during in-school interventions, after school sessions and in summer school, often with qualified teachers.</p>	Cost: £6,670
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
